### FROM THE PASTOR...

This past Friday we celebrated the most important day in American history. On this supremely significant day 249 years ago, fifty-six British landowning men signed a watershed document, the Declaration of Independence, in a little-known Pennsylvania colony. And this document would pave the future of what would arguably become the greatest nation in the world, the United States of America.

How are we as Catholic Christians and Americans supposed to celebrate this great day? John Adams, one of the Founding Fathers of our country, wrote this about how to celebrate the fourth of July:

"It ought to be commemorated as the Day of Deliverance by solemn Acts of Devotion to God Almighty. It ought to be solemnized with Pomp and Parade, with shews, games, Sports, Guns, Bells, Bonfires and illuminations from one End of this Continent to the other from this Time forward forever more."

Well, let's see how we're doing in celebrating the fourth of July the way one of the greatest Founders envisioned. Parades? Check. Pomp? Check. Sports? Backyard games? Check. Fireworks? Double check. Solemn Acts of Devotions to God

Almighty? Um...not quite sure how that fits into the many festivities.

But John Adams set an example for us. After everything's said and done, we owe God more than anyone else for what occurred nearly 250 years ago. In fact, the most famous part of the Declaration of Independence explicitly points to God as the source of our freedom:

"We hold these truths to be self-evident, that all men are created equal, that they are endowed by their Creator with certain unalienable rights, that among these rights are life, liberty, and the pursuit of happiness."

Not our parents, or politicians, or government, is the source of our most important rights. Only God. As the source of our rights, he deserves the highest praise, honor, and glory on Independence Day (and every day). There are many ways to honor God during this special time. Perhaps you can read a passage from the <u>Catholic Bible</u> with your family to kick off the festivities, or pray a <u>rosary</u> with the special intention for our political leaders and our country's future.

Or you could pray this simple prayer for our nation written by George Washington, our first President:

"Almighty God, who has given us this good land for our heritage: We humbly beseech you that we may always prove ourselves a people mindful of your favor and glad to do your will. Bless our land with honorable industry, sound learning, and pure manners. Save us from violence, discord, and confusion; from pride and arrogance, and from every evil way.

Defend our liberties, and fashion into one united people the multitudes brought hither out of many kindreds and tongues. Endue with the spirit of wisdom those to whom your Name we entrust the authority of government, that there may be justice and peace at home, and that, through obedience to your law, we may show forth your praise among the nations of the earth. In the time of prosperity, fill our hearts with thankfulness and in the day of trouble, do not allow our trust in you to fall; all this we ask through Jesus Christ our Lord." AMEN!

When I was in seminary, we had a professor who would always remark, "It's freedom of religion, not freedom from religion". When a society completely removes their creator: the source of all gifts, talents, skills, blessings, etc., from their conscience, and places complete reliance on themselves, the world becomes a much more difficult place to co-exist. May we revel in the independence of our nation, but even more so, revel in our dependence in our God.

### YOUTH FAITH FORMATION

Registration is under way for the 2025-2026 Faith Formation year. Returning families should have their registration packet. If you are new to the parish or have a child entering



Kindergarten or First Grade call Marcy at the parish office for information about YFF and to request a registration packet.

First Grade is required in order to prepare for First Reconciliation and First Eucharist in second grade. It is expected that grades three through seven are completed before entering eighth grade and Confirmation preparations.

Kindergarten is not required but highly encouraged. We limit the Kindergarten class to 10 children. If you are considering registering your child for Kindergarten YFF, be sure to get your registration packet in early to ensure a spot for your child.

# SPONSOR GUIDELNE FOR BAPTISM AND CONFIRMATION

It is an honor to be asked to be a sponsor (godparent) for Baptism or Confirmation. It means that you are seen as someone who is practicing their faith and living a life that reflects the teachings of the Catholic faith. Sponsors need to be:

- Registered in a parish. (adult children, 25 years old, need to be registered independently)
- 2. Attending Mass regularly at their parish of registration.
- 3. If married, a valid marriage recognized by the Catholic Church.
- 4. Forming their children in the faith. (religious education or Catholic School)

You will be asked to submit a letter of eligibility as a sponsor, signed by the pastor of your current parish. These are universal norms for the Catholic faith, found in Canon Law (nos. 872-874).
