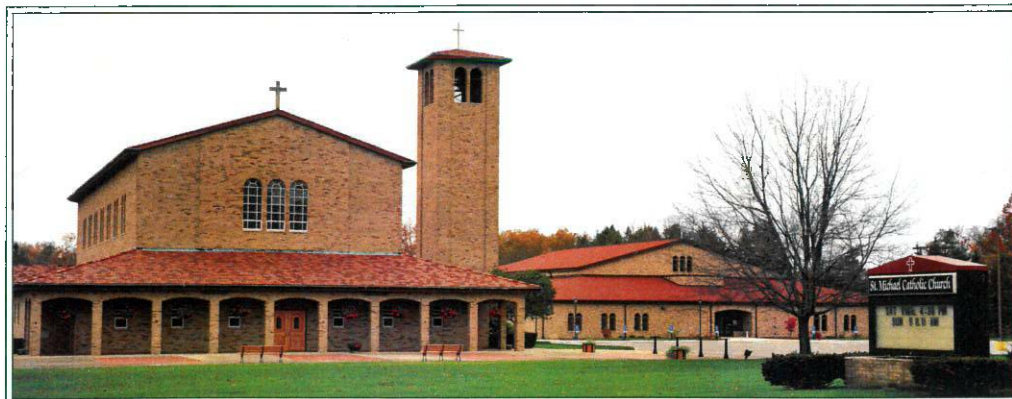

**FROM THE PASTOR . . .**

This weekend, we are privileged to journey closer with our brothers and sisters who have chosen to become one with us in the Easter Sacraments at the Easter Vigil in just four weeks.

On the 3rd, 4th, and 5th Sundays of Lent, the newly named “Elect” participate in three successive rites called “the Scrutinies.” These rites, with roots dating back to the early Church, take place during the Sunday Mass, and each is thematically linked to the Gospel reading for that Mass. The three passages from St. John’s Gospel for these Sundays were selected around 500 AD as powerful depictions of the hidden transformation God effects in the Elect through each Scrutiny. Each proclamation emphasizes repentance and conversion as the Light of Christ comes to pierce the darkness of sin and to bring life where there is death.

The “Elect”, having been named so in a ceremony with Bishop Bonnar on the 1<sup>st</sup> Sunday of Lent, along with their sponsors, stand before the celebrant and the assembly, who pray for them silently and with a series of intercessions. Culminating in a prayer of cleansing and protection with the laying-on-of-hands, each Scrutiny is a step in preparing the Elect for the celebration and initiation soon to come.

The Scrutinies are God’s way of taking a close, loving look at the Elect. God does not scrutinize the Catechumens in order to find everything that’s wrong with them, but to celebrate all that is beautiful and good and true in them. Jesus “scrutinizes” us with Divine Light, revealing all that is valuable within us. He also reveals to us the ways in which we are hurting, or sick, or sinful. This is not to reject us, but to call us to new life and to healing. These prayers are simply ways of calling on God and trusting in God’s power, not only to affirm what is good within us, but to dispel whatever holds us back or causes us to resist grace and goodness in our lives.

May these Scrutinies call both our Elect and all of us into the living waters of baptism, to the light of holiness, to a new life in Christ, through His Resurrection.

As Bishop Bonnar has provided a dispensation from the requirement to abstain from eating meat on Saint Patrick’s Day, Friday, March 17, 2023, we will not be holding our weekly Fish Dinner on that day. The dinners will resume on Friday, March 24<sup>th</sup>, and Friday, March 31<sup>st</sup>. May everyone have a wonderful celebration of the Saint Patrick’s Day Feast.

## LIGHTING PROJECT UNDERWAY

As you can clearly see (no pun intended), the lighting project is well underway. This past week, the electricians focused on the side sections. This Monday, a large lift will arrive to begin the installation of the main chandeliers and the additional lighting affixed to the ceiling beams. Work is also being done to enhance the sanctuary lighting and to illuminate the large window of the Archangels and the image of the Risen Christ. The unit that controls all of this – a lighting and dimming panel, has yet to arrive. As such, all lighting is currently at “full capacity”. Once the panel is installed, we will be working with it to provide the best settings for various liturgical seasons, as well as times of year. After many years of more subdued lighting, this may seem rather bright to some. Some will stare at the light fixture and say – “this is way too bright”. Of course, that will happen if you stare into the light. We do not stare into the light bulbs in the lamps in our homes. We simply allow the light to shine so we can see everything we need to. The finished project will allow us to clearly see everything, for our reading and singing, as well as our understanding and appreciation of all our worship entails. Thank you again to the many wonderful members of our parish family who have sponsored the vast majority of this project. There are still four large center chandeliers available for sponsorship at a cost of \$10,000 each. Hopefully, if we stay on track, everyone will be able to see them next weekend. If you are interested, please contact the parish office. Again, May the Light of Christ shine on us always and everywhere.
