

These two medals which perhaps symbolize not the resulting goal of peace, but rather, the great labor to bring that gift about, rest just miles apart. Let the good works begun in those like Dr. King and President Carter, and so many others, continue in our efforts to bridge racial, political, and economic divides, and see ourselves as in our reading today – all servants of the Lord, commanded to do what he tells us, thus working to bring about miracle after miracle in our world.

### WEEK OF PRAYER FOR CHRISTIAN UNITY

The theme for the 2026 Week of Prayer for Christian Unity, January 18-25, 2026, is *"There is one body, and one spirit, just as you are called to the one hope of your calling."* (Ephesians 4:4). This year's theme highlights the importance of reconciliation and communal support among diverse Christian traditions.

### CELEBRATING CHRISTIAN UNITY

This weekend, in addition to many things we have to celebrate and observe, we celebrate a week of Christian Unity. The Week of Prayer for Christian Unity is framed by the Confession of Peter on January 18 (Lutheran and Anglican liturgical calendar) and the Conversion of Paul on January 25 (Catholic, Lutheran, and Anglican calendars). Jesus prayed (John 17) that we would manifest the unity of the body of Christ, living into the fullness of his prayer and the unity of God. While we should live and serve in unity with our friends in Christ throughout the year, during this focused time in January the Lutheran-Catholic Covenant Commission (Catholic Diocese of Youngstown and Northeastern Ohio Lutheran Synod, ELCA) encourages us to pray with and for our friends in Christ from diverse cultures, traditions, and confessions around the world and in our neighboring communities.

Let us pray: *Lord God of all creation, source of life and of unity in all who believe. As Jesus prayed that his followers might be one, make us one with all who bear his name, so that in peace and concord we may carry to the world the message of your love, shining a bright light of healing and hope, through Jesus Christ, who is our light and our hope. ## STEWARDSHIP – January 18, 2026

### Second Sunday in Ordinary Time

*“Now the Lord has spoken who formed me as his servant from the womb...” (Isaiah 49:5)*

God has given each of us different gifts. In order for God’s plan to work, you have to do what God is calling you to do, and I have to do what God is calling me to do. And guess what? God has given each of us a different plan! So, stop comparing yourself to others. Don’t let envy and jealousy enter your life. Be thankful for the gifts God has given you and become the saint that God is calling you to be.

### FEAST OF SAINT AGNES

Saint Agnes of Rome, whose feast is on January 21, is frequently depicted in religious art with a lamb. Not only that, but each year lambs are also blessed on her feast day and their wool used to make a pallium, a white scarf-like vestment that is worn over the chasuble of a metropolitan bishop. First of all, the primary connection between St. Agnes of Rome and lambs is her name, "Agnes." The Latin word for lamb is *agnus*, and as a result, her name means, "lamb." There is a story that Saint Agnes once appeared near her grave, with other women dressed in gold and silver and white robes, and a lamb more dazzling white than ever seen. In that appearance, Saint Agnes said to her parents: "Take heed and see that grieve me no more as dead, but be joyful with me, for with all these virgins Jesus Christ has given me the brightest habitation and dwelling and am with him joined in heaven whom in earth I loved with my every thought." In this story the presence of a lamb symbolized purity and refers to the purity of her life. Ever since, Saint Agnes has almost always been depicted with a lamb, and lambs continue to be blessed on her feast day – from which the yoke of leadership in the church is woven. On this feast of Saint Agnes, let us pray for our Holy Father, and all who exercise leadership in the Church – in the name of Agnus Dei – the Lamb of God.

## From Daniel LaPolla, Seminarian

*For the month of January, I have chosen to share about the life and charism of Saint HYACINTHA MARISCOTTI- Religious*

Saint Hyacintha's real name was Clarice Marisotti. She was born into a noble Italian family and educated in a Franciscan convent, where one of her sisters was already a nun. At 17, she was hoping to be married to a nobleman, Marquis, to continue her luxurious life. Instead, she was passed over and her younger sister was given to Marquis in marriage. Such news provoked Clarice toward a pique and morose temper, which made her insufferable. In response, the family, which was customary of her time, "practically forced" her into the Franciscan convent (Butler Lives of the Saint, 207). There she received the name, Sister Hyacintha.

Though she was fully professed and externally lived out her profession, she still desired to receive every privilege that could be afforded to her by her family's status and wealth. After ten years of duplicitous living she fell ill and was visited by a Franciscan priest who strongly challenged her to live in a manner worthy of her religious profession. She then made radical changes to her life. However, as human nature goes, her religious fervor would cool off. Yet, Providence would allow her to become seriously ill, which would reawaken Hyacinth's religious devotion.. Her new radical life was carried on by strong self-discipline, constant fasts and deprivation of sleep for longer hours of prayer.

Interestingly, God gifted Hyacintha with the grace of healthy common sense used for guiding the novices, sisters in early formation, to live balanced devotional and penitential lives free of excesses. Her charity grew beyond her own community, establishing two groups who were dedicated to serving the sick, aged, marginalized and poor. Often Hyacinth would even beg on the street to obtain funds for their charitable groups. In her bull of canonization it states that, *"through her apostolate of charity she won more souls to God than many preachers of her time".*

The charism Saint Hyacintha teaches us today is that a holy life stems from a humble and converted heart. Hyacintha, before and during her entrance into the convent, was entirely self-focused, seeking to get what she wanted instead of responding to what God had given her. It took holy words of discipline to convert her heart, to reconcile herself to God and her vocational calling, which led to holy actions. Through Hyacintha's intercession, let us reexamine and renew our hearts, in order that all our actions may simply be for the love of God and our neighbor.

## SPONSOR GUIDELINE FOR BAPTISM AND CONFIRMATION

It is an honor to be asked to be a sponsor (godparent) for Baptism or Confirmation. It means that you are seen as someone who is practicing their faith and living a life that reflects the teachings of the Catholic faith. Sponsors need to be:

1. Registered in a parish.  
(adult children, 25 years old, need to be registered independently)
2. Attending Mass regularly at their parish of registration.
3. If married, a valid marriage recognized by the Catholic Church.
4. Forming their children in the faith.  
(religious education or Catholic School)

You will be asked to submit a letter of eligibility as a sponsor, signed by the pastor of your current parish. These are universal norms for the Catholic faith, found in Canon Law (nos. 872-874).

## SACRAMENTAL INFORMATION

### *Anointing of the Sick*

This Sacrament can be celebrated before any surgery or if you are experiencing a serious illness. Please call the parish office (330-533-6839) to schedule. Due to the many duties of Father Lavelle, please allow time when calling to schedule a visit.

### *Baptism*

If you would like to have your child baptized please call the parish office at 330-533-6839. Parents must be registered parishioners for at least 6 months and attend Mass regularly. Parents may need to attend a Baptism Class usually held on the last Wednesday of the month. Godparents must provide a letter of suitability from the parish where they are registered. One godparent must be Catholic.

### *Marriage*

Couples requesting a wedding must be registered and active members of the parish for at least 6 months before a date can be reserved. If you are 25 years old and still registered under your parents registration, you need to register independently. A Pre-Cana class sponsored by the diocese is required as well as meeting with Father Lavelle a few months prior to your wedding.
