FROM THE PASTOR . . .

I am writing this the morning after this past Tuesday's election. It was a challenging day for sure. The majority of Ohioans have spoken in favor of having the "right" to terminate the life of an unborn child. This will become the law in less than thirty days. To add insult to injury, as the saying goes, our parish property (as a polling site) was laced with not only "Vote Yes" signs, but with signs that read "68% of Catholics are Pro Choice – Vote Yes". As I stated to the press that contacted me regarding the placement of these signs, whether they were strictly at Catholic polling places or not, we were obviously targeted as a group. The Catholic Church's teaching on the sanctity of life and our opposition to such acts as abortion are well known. Additionally, there were no other signs targeting other religious or ethnic groups. All in all – a sad commentary on the process and the result.

Regardless – we are now challenged with two actions. First, to continue to pray for the unborn, and especially for the conversion of heart among those who would seek this as their only "option". Second, we must continue to create an environment

of help and hope. A great number of individuals who look to abortion do so based on their economic and social support. With our help, we need to offer the physical and emotional support necessary to assist people, especially those living in poverty, to discover the hope needed to see a more viable option for life. How blessed are we to be able to respond to as many needs as possible.

The vast majority of our requests for Christmas assistance are from women with small children. Thank you so much for your generous response to our Christmas Giving Program. Please make sure to take an ornament and envelope from one of the wreathes. Keep the ornament for your own tree as a reminder to pray for them during the holidays. Also, the incredible tradition of the Turkey Connection that provides Thanksgiving meals to hundreds of people, including young families has been such a wonderful blessing in our community. Please note, this year, this will happen on **TUESDAY, November 21st**. This was at the request of one of the agencies we partner with in serving the meals. The buses do not run on Thanksgiving, and it was greatly limiting the number of people we could serve. This is a perfect example of how sometimes, even after a long period of time, something needs to change in order to meet the current need. Thank you in advance for your generosity to the Turkey Connection. We will also be announcing a project for January beginning with the Masses for the 4th Sunday of Advent. This will be a great way to help many young people in the area step into the future – just a little teaser!

As Catholics, our "choice" must always be to support life at every stage. And that choice cannot simply be a "nine-month" cycle, or a "cafeteria style" approach to one or two issues. Thank you to everyone for your prayers and your support of all in need. As we continue in this season of thanks, let us thank God for an abundance of blessings, most especially that we are alive! Let us work to bring that same blessing to others.

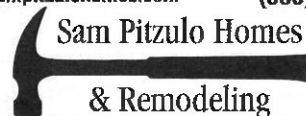
