FROM THE PASTOR ...

Thank you to Father Korda for being with us this weekend, as I celebrate the Masses in Salem and Leetonia. As announced last weekend, Bishop Bonnar has asked that I serve as the temporary administrator of Saint Paul and Saint Patrick while the pastor, Monsignor Polando, is on a leave of absence. Bishop has appointed Father Tom Eisweirth and Father Jim Korda as the Sacramental Ministers, so they will be celebrating the vast majority of the Weekend Masses at Saint Paul and Saint Patrick. There will be no changes to our Mass schedule, either on the weekend or weekdays. Thank you for your understanding as we work to meet the needs of all our parishes.

THE TRANSFIGURATION

On witnessing Jesus' Transfiguration and seeing Jesus with Elijah and Moses, Peter offers to construct three tents for them. Having just awoken, perhaps Peter's offer was made in confusion. We also notice that Peter reverted from his earlier confession that Jesus is the Messiah, calling Jesus "master" instead. As if in reply to Peter's confusion, a voice from heaven speaks, affirming Jesus as God's Son and commanding that the disciples listen to him. This voice from heaven recalls the voice that was heard at Jesus' baptism which, in Luke's Gospel, spoke directly to Jesus as God's Son.

In his Transfiguration, we see an anticipation of the glory of Jesus' Resurrection. In each of the reports of the Transfiguration, the disciples keep secret what they have seen. Not until they also witness his Passion and death will the disciples understand Jesus' Transfiguration. We hear this story of Jesus' Transfiguration early in Lent, but we have the benefit of hindsight. In our hearing of it, we anticipate Jesus' Resurrection even as we prepare to remember Jesus' Passion and death.

SAINT PATRICK'S DAY

As Bishop Bonnar has provided a dispensation from the requirement to abstain from eating meat on Saint Patrick's Day, Friday, March 17, 2023, we will not be holding our weekly Fish Dinner on that day. The dinners will be held this Friday, March 10th, and resume on Friday, March 24th, and Friday, March 31st. May everyone have a wonderful celebration of the Saint Patrick's Day Feast.



Our Lenten Reconciliation Service at Saint Michael Parish will be celebrated on Wednesday, March 8 at 7:00PM. The Sacrament of Reconciliation offers to us the healing grace of God. Please plan on joining us to receive the Sacrament of Reconciliation as part of your Lenten journey in preparation for Easter.

SAINT PATRICK'S DAY DISPENSATION

Given the Church's discipline which Catholics aged 14 and over are required to abstain from eating meat on Ash Wednesday and each Friday during the Season of Lent. This year, however, Friday of the third week of Lent corresponds with Saint Patrick's Day (March 17) which has traditionally been an occasion of importance in the lives of so many in the Diocese of Youngstown. Having taken into consideration both past practices and present circumstances and having judged that it would serve the spiritual good of the faithful. Bishop Bonnar has granted to the faithful of the Diocese of Youngstown, as well as to any visitor or travelers who may be physically present within the territory of this diocese, a dispensation from the obligation of abstinence from meat on March 17, 2023.

Those taking advantage of the dispensation are urged to make some other act of Lenten sacrifice of charity, such as the public celebration of the Stations of the Cross, the giving of time in a charitable way, the spending of time in devout prayer before the Blessed sacrament, praying for vocations, the Divine Mercy Chaplet or the rosary.
