

FROM THE PASTOR...

This Wednesday, we will gather to commit ourselves to our annual Lenten journey. Enriched with the Word of God, nourished with the Body of Christ, and marked with the Ashes of Repentance, we are sent out into the world, much like Christ in the desert. Our journey is one that seeks to renew us in the constant process of conversion. Through the traditional practices of Prayer, Fasting, and Almsgiving, we are invited to reflect more deeply on our relationship with God, ourselves, and others. May this coming season of Lent become more than a "this is what we always do" approach, and rather, challenge us to discover a greater sense of devotion in living out our faith. A reminder that we will have three Masses on Ash Wednesday to begin this holy season - 8:00am, 12:15pm and 6:00pm. Please plan to join with our parish family as we prepare ourselves for the joy of the Easter Resurrection. As the words of Paul's letter to the Corinthians, heard every Ash Wednesday remind us, "Behold, now is a very acceptable time; behold, now is the day of salvation".

PRAYER, while always necessary for our relationship with God, is a valuable part of the Lenten journey. We are invited to consider increased participation at Mass, the prayer of the Stations of the Cross, or other forms of prayer – all leading us to a deeper understanding of God's presence in our lives.

FASTING refers to limitations on food and drink. The regulations of fast prescribe taking only one full meal a day, with two smaller ones; nothing in between meals. There are two days of fast: Ash Wednesday and Good Friday. Additionally, individuals are asked to reflect on their lives, and seek to fast from something that has kept them from focusing more on their relationship with the Lord (i.e. – excessive TV or social media, certain foods or vices, etc.).

ABSTAINING means refraining from certain kinds of food or drink, typically meat. Ash Wednesday and all the Fridays of Lent including Good Friday are days of abstaining from meat.

ALMSGIVING, like prayer, should always be part of our Christian journey, but like prayer, becomes a heightened awareness and understanding during the Lenten season. Consider your gift to the 2024 Annual Diocesan Appeal - One in Hope, One in Mission, contributions to the Holy Week collections for Catholic Relief Services (Rice Bowl on Holy Thursday and the Holy Land on Good Friday), as well as an increased contributions to the parish and other charities of choice. Don't forget our "Green Eggs (or any color) and Ham" collection. Like the very successful Turkey Connection, we will be collecting Hams (not baked) and colored Easter eggs for Easter Dinners at area soup kitchens. This will be on Tuesday, March 26, from 10am - 3pm in the parish hall.

CLEAN UP YOUR ACT FOR LENT

Beginning next weekend, we will be collecting personal hygiene and household cleaning items for those in need throughout our community. Any items may be placed in the bins located at the entrances of the Church. All items will then be distributed through Catholic Charities. Thank you in advance for your kindness and generosity.

WORLD DAY OF THE SICK

The theme for the 32nd World Day of the Sick, which will be observed on February 11, 2024, is inspired by the Book of Genesis: "It is not good that man should be alone." The theme is further subtitled as "Healing the Sick by Healing Relationships." In his message, Pope Francis emphasizes the fundamental importance and healing power of our relationships with others and with God. This theme invites us to recognize that human beings are created for communion and that healing extends beyond physical ailments to include the restoration of relationships and connections. Let us continue to pray for a greater healing among all in need. Our Lady of Lourdes, pray for us!



ANNUAL DIOCESAN APPEAL One in Hope, One in Mission

In today's Gospel story, Jesus cleanses a leper with the word, "Be made clean" (Mark 1:41). The faith of this leper moves God to give him the outward cleanliness he sought. This healing would allow him to reenter Jewish society, from which he had been cast out.

Jesus says he came that "they might have life and have it more abundantly" (John 10:10). He didn't just come to cleanse the outside, like the Pharisees, who "cleanse the outside of the cup and the dish" (Luke 11:39). He came to renew all of us, outside and in.

We need your help to meet the many needs of those around you; Jesus says that, "As to what is within, give alms, and behold, everything will be made clean for you." (Luke 11:41). Jesus says there is a connection between almsgiving and the true cleanness of life which the Jews sought. Small wonder: Almsgiving requires sacrifice. It requires the same spirit of sacrifice that we need to take up our personal cross valiantly. Our Annual Diocesan Appeal is in full swing, and we encourage you to take this opportunity to help us help others.

REAL PRESENCE BOOK STUDY

What does it mean when we say that Christ is truly present in the Eucharist? Join us for our Lenten book study and find out! As a part of our observance of the Eucharistic Revival, we will be enhancing our understanding of the real presence of Christ in the Eucharist, using Timothy O'Malley's book Real Presence: What Does it Mean and Why Does It Matter? Groups will meet Tuesday evenings from 6:30-8:00pm on February 13, 20, and March 5, 12, and 19, and on Thursday mornings from 8:30-10:00am, on February 15, 22, and March 7, 14, and 21.


